Pastor Jen Nagel will be installed as the fourth bishop of the Minneapolis Area Synod ELCA at Central Lutheran Church on Saturday, September 21, at 10:30 a.m. The Minneapolis Area Synod is the largest in terms of members of the 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA); it is one of the smallest geographically – ranging from Cambridge to Braham to Henderson to Monticello to New Prague, all surrounding Minneapolis. The 137 congregations of the synod have 175,000 members. Bishop-elect Nagel succeeds Bishop Ann Svennungsen, who served for the last 12 years.

Information about Bishop-elect Nagel and the ELCA:

- Pastor Jen was elected by voting members from each of the synod's 137 congregations on the fifth ballot on May 4, 2024
- Pastor Jen was originally ordained by "extraordinary circumstances," as the ELCA did not ordain people in monogamous, same-sex relationships at the time.
- Pastor Jen's spouse, Jane McBride, is a pastor in the United Church of Christ, a denomination with which the ELCA is in ecumenical relationship
- Pastor Jen will be installed as bishop by Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, the ranking leader of the ELCA, which is headquartered in Chicago.
- The ELCA is the largest Lutheran denomination in the U.S., with about 3 million members.
