Our mission is to accompany Latino families, providing support and community activities to strengthen understanding that the work of Christ is love for ALL.


#### We also are:

#### Soccer

As we listened to the community, we heard there was a need for safe activities for children. We started to build relationships in the community by offering a free soccer program. Our first year, we had over 50 children and youth registered. We also offered a smaller basketball program. For the last two summers, we began another soccer program in a second mobile home park.





#### Homework Help

We also heard that many children were struggling with school because of language barriers and working parents not able to help with homework. The teachers were overwhelmed with so many children below grade level.

Four days a week, we help support the Chaska School District's after school program at the Riverview Terrace Mobile Home Park. We have volunteers from partner congregations that help the children with homework. We also plan activities for special celebrations.





#### Day Camps

During summers, we were able to provide day camps for the children on weeks the school district did not provide programming to help provide a safe space while parents are working.











#### During COVID

We listened to people's needs during Covid. We were able to provide over \$5,000 in food support to families in need with the help of our partner congregations. We also had a Virtual Vacation Bible School. And distributed soccer balls to keep children active.

### Religious Celebrations

As we built relationships in the communities, people began to ask about the Lutheran church. We slowly introduced faith elements. We first held celebrations for Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead, the Posadas (a Christmas event), and Ashes to Go (for Ash Wednesday). We are now worshipping 1-2 times per month.









#### Worship Every Sunday?

Not quite there yet. The people we accompany have often been hurt by the church and are dechurched. We are working on building trusted relationship with them.

Sometimes the sacraments are cookies & juice at the After School Program. The liturgy is helping a child to read. And the confession is listening to our neighbor's pain. That is church, too!
