Memorial on Child and Vulnerable Adult Safety Policies and Procedures

3 WHEREAS one in four women and one in six men are sexually abused or assaulted by their 18th

- 4 birthday^{1,2}, and there are survivors and perpetrators in our churches; and
- 5 WHEREAS all people are created by God in the divine image, and human sexuality is a gracious
- 6 gift of God. The family of God is called to stand firmly and pastorally against all forms of abuse.
- 7 Sexual abuse and harassment betray God's creation, inflict grievous suffering on the victims, and
- 8 rend the fabric of the whole community of the people of God³; and
- 9 WHEREAS sexual abuse and harassment in the church has been a matter of concern to the
- 10 Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) since it formed in 1988. The first churchwide
- assembly in 1989 passed a resolution on making the church a safe place, free from sexual abuse
- and harassment. Synods, seminaries, congregations, colleges, social ministry organizations and
- the churchwide expression have struggled with these issues since our beginnings⁴; and
- 14 WHEREAS the ELCA's social message on gender-based violence states that "Christian churches
- and individuals too often have contributed to gender-based violence through denial, resistance
- and a lack of preparation...operating with inadequate policies and practices contribute to the
- 17 problem"⁵; and
- WHEREAS all forms of sexual abuse and harassment are unacceptable within the life of the
- 19 church. The church should be a safe place where people can worship, learn, work, love and
- 20 receive care in a manner that is free from sexual misconduct⁶; and
- 21 WHEREAS when sexual abuse and harassment occurs, not only the victim and their family
- suffer; but the entire congregation suffers emotionally, spiritually, and financially; and
- 23 WHEREAS a written policy statement is an important first step toward preventing sexual abuse
- or harassment; and education and training are among the chief means of prevention, therefore be

- 26 RESOLVED, that the Minneapolis Area Synod (MAS), in assembly, memorializes the 2025
- 27 Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA to direct that all synods of the ELCA oversee the
- 28 implementation and maintenance of policies and procedures in their congregations, including
- 29 regular training and resources, which safeguard children and vulnerable adults; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, that the 2025 MAS Assembly memorializes the 2025 Churchwide Assembly to
- 31 forward this memorial to the ELCA Church Council's Executive Committee for referral and
- 32 disposition to the appropriate unit or office of the churchwide organization in accordance with
- 33 the bylaws and continuing resolutions of this church.
