Resolution on Accompanying Immigrants

- 3 WHEREAS, care and equal justice for the stranger and the call to practice hospitality is a moral
- 4 imperative in our scriptures¹; and

- 5 WHEREAS, the Minneapolis Area Synod of the ELCA, in its diversity, is home to many immigrant
- 6 communities and congregations; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the 1998 ELCA Social Message on Immigration proclaims: "We draw on the best of our
- 8 nation's traditions as a refuge and haven for the persecuted and destitute when we affirm that we support a
- 9 generous policy of welcome for refugees and immigrants, and that we will advocate for just immigration
- 10 policies including fairness in visa regulations and in admitting and protecting refugees"; and
- 11 WHEREAS, "the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) defines accompaniment as walking
- 12 alongside others in solidarity and mutuality. It's a way of understanding a mission that's based on scripture
- and practical experience." (ELCA Blog, ELCA World Hunger); and
- 14 WHEREAS, the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly voted to become the nation's first Sanctuary
- 15 Denomination; therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED, that the Minneapolis Area Synod (MAS) provide opportunities for continuing education and
- training for rostered leaders on the topic of accompanying immigrants; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, that the Bishop of the MAS appoint a synod immigration task force to accomplish the
- 19 following concrete objectives: identify increased funding sources and coordinate a synod-wide appeal for
- 20 the benefit of our new and strategic ministries and immigrants and refugees within the synod; curate legal
- 21 aid resources for individuals within the synod; and work with the office of the Bishop of the MAS to
- 22 coordinate education, resources, and funding for this work; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, that congregations be encouraged to make use of training opportunities and resources
- provided by the synod and non-profits serving immigrants such as Accompanying Migrants with
- 25 Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO), Global Refuge, and Lutheran
- 26 Social Services; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, that congregations hold special offerings in support of immigrant-focused non-profits or
- 28 new and strategic ministries and to pray for immigrant communities in their worship services regularly;
- and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, that this assembly urge the Bishop of the MAS, with guidance from legal counsel, to act
- 31 without regard to immigration laws which are contrary to the 1998 ELCA Social Message on Immigration
- and the United States Constitution and support MAS congregations which choose to ignore these laws;
- 33 and be it further
- 34 RESOLVED, that the Bishop of the MAS prioritize the call to action and advocacy for immigrants and
- refugees at a state and federal legislative level and implement the recommendations of the immigration
- 36 task force.
