Resolution: Response to the Destruction of Palestinians

3 WHEREAS the ceasefire in Gaza requires Christians to take urgent steps toward recovery and healing, 1

- 5 WHEREAS the church calls all disciples to be advocates for peacemaking that strives for human rights,
- 6 political alternatives to war, social justice, control of the arms trade, and creative means of working for
- 7 peace in God's world, and
- 8 WHEREAS 2024 was the deadliest year on record for Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank, and the
- 9 displacement of millions of people in Gaza and Lebanon occurred even while the ELCA has called for an
- end to unconditional aid to the State of Israel,² and
- WHEREAS some definitions of antisemitism equate opposition to policies of the State of Israel with
- 12 antisemitism, target political criticism of Israel on college campuses, and enable false claims of
- antisemitism making it difficult to identify real incidents of antisemitism,³ and
- 14 WHEREAS the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2016 voted (with 90% in favor) to develop a human
- rights social criteria investment screen to apply to investments in the State of Israel, and voted (with 82%
- in favor) for the U.S. to link financial and military aid to Israel to Israel's compliance with internationally
- 17 recognized human rights standards and other criteria⁴; therefore, be it
- 18 RESOLVED, that the Minneapolis Area Synod (MAS) acting in assembly reject silent complicity with
- 19 destruction of Palestinians, and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, that this Assembly ask the Bishop of the MAS to speak out for the value of all lives in the
- 21 Holy Lands Jewish, Muslim, Christian, Arab and Middle Eastern and to communicate to the MAS
- area members of Congress and Minnesota U.S. Senators that the MAS asks them to stop using our U.S.
- 23 tax dollars to fund weapons that potentially harm Palestinians and other civilians in adjacent countries,
- and instead prohibit providing weaponry and military assistance; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, that the MAS reject definitions of antisemitism that do not distinguish between hatred of
- Jews and criticism of the State of Israel, and all Islamophobia and antisemitism which harms our Muslim
- and Jewish neighbors locally and globally, and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, that this Assembly ask the MAS and its congregations, in accordance with the 2016
- 29 screening decision, to review current and future investments that profit from Israel's violations of
- 30 Palestinian human rights.
