Synod Mission Statement

The Minneapolis Area Synod works together so that all experience gracious invitation into life-giving Christian community and live in just and healthy neighborhoods.

About the Synod

- Our synod spans all or part of eight counties: Anoka, Carver, Hennepin, Isanti, LeSeuer, Scott, Sherburne, Wright.
- The worship attendance in our churches ranges from a few people to more than a thousand every week in 134 congregations and three Synodically Authorized Worshipping Communities (SAWCs)
- The current synod staff consists of 5 full-time positions, 5 full-time grant-funded positions, and 8 part-time positions (that equal almost 3 fulltime positions) that support the Bishop and the work of the synod
- We worship in 11 languages: Amharic, ASL, English, Hmong, Lao, Norwegian, Oromo, Spanish, Swahili, Tigre, Togolese French
- The synod is divided into 12 geographically into 12 conferences
- We are a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) synod
- Racial make-up of synod members:
 95.39% Caucasian, 1.46% Multi-racial,
 0.94% African American, 0.83% Hispanic/Latino,
 0.64% Asian/Pacific Islander, 0.44% African
 National/African Caribbean, 0.21% American
 Indian/Alaska Native, 0.08% Arab/Middle Eastern

Ministry Support

New Ministries and Networking

- Supports mission starts and redeveloping ministries
- Strategizes for growth and development so congregations can learn from each other

Transitions

 Supports congregations through various changes, including leadership and redevelopment changes

Congregations

 The synod office supports congregations by providing support with Training (e.g., Tool Kits, Boundaries Trainings), Governance, Organizing, and Imagination Grants

Specialized Ministries

 The synod office supports rostered ministers serving in hospitals, prisons, educational institutions, and full communion partnerships by aiding in logistics, providing gathering opportunities, and offering trainings

Prospective Leaders

 The Synod accompanies those who wish to be ordained into service in the church through the entire Candidacy process, beginning with Entrance, and through Endorsement, Internship, Approval, Assignment, and Call.

Partnerships

• The synod maintains many global and regional partnerships.

- Congregational mission support, grants in support of synod initiatives, and the Resurrection Fund
- Current grant-funded initiatives include Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices, and Racial and Climate Justice organizing

Roles and Responsibilities of the Bishop

Support of Leaders

- Hosts educational opportunities for rostered leaders, including semi-annual Ministeriums and annual Bishop's Theological Conferences and Boundaries Trainings
- Provides spiritual care for leaders
- Encourages participation in Peer Groups
- Handles disciplinary matters

Administration and Leadership

- Interprets and advocates the mission and theology of the whole church
- Provides oversight of synod budget
- Supervises clergy mobility process
- Convenes synod deans
- Participates in Conference of Bishops
- Engages in leadership among regional agencies and institutions, including service on governing boards (e.g., Luther Seminary, Augsburg University, Minnesota Council of Churches)
- Supervises synod staff
 - The current synod staff consists of 5 full-time positions, 5 full-time grant-funded positions, and 8 part-time positions (that equal almost 3 full-time positions) that support the Bishop and the work of the synod
